FUNDRAISING FOR CRISIS

We are pleased to announce our Christmas fundraising initiative launched by the children last term to raise money for the homeless raised £233.36. The funds were donated to Crisis and enabled eight homeless people to have a brief respite from the streets and to enjoy three cooked meals, a shower and proper bed for the night. It seems



very little to expect but obviously means a good deal to people with nowhere else to go. We are planning to fundraise again next year so that we can continue to support this cause and hopefully increase the support we can provide. Thank you for your help and thank you to our pupils for taking the initiative.

SCHOOL MEAL PAYMENTS

A polite reminder to all families that the cost of a school meal is £2.30 $^{\circ}$

(foundation phase) or £2.40 (key stage 2) per day. School meals are provided by Lorraen Catering whose policy is to refuse to provide a school lunch following non-payment of five meals (i.e. an outstanding balance of approximately £12.00). Children of parent/carers with an outstanding balance like this will not be given a lunch until the money owing has been paid. Under these circumstances it will be necessary to provide your child with a packed lunch to ensure that they have sufficient food to eat during the day. Our office staff are always on hand to assist any parents/carers who may wish, in confidence, to seek information or help in applying for financial support for school meals.

ATTENDANCE



We are keen to improve pupils' overall attendance. Following suggestions from the School Council we have introduced a number of initiatives to encourage pupils to attend well. These have included non-uniform Fridays for classes with over 95% attendance in any given week, together with squash and

biscuits for those classes who achieve a 'hatrick' of 95+. We discuss the importance of good attendance regularly and it is always a focus in our Monday Values Assembly when the top two classes are awarded our attendance mascots, the school penguins 'Sam' and 'Otis'. We strongly believe that good attendance is in every pupils' interest.

All parents will receive a letter this week which will detail your child's attendance for the first half of this year. These letters are provided so that you can see the overall picture of your child's attendance. Any pupil whose attendance is below the school target of 95% will be banded amber or red (below 90%). Pupils in amber and red bands are losing valuable time in school. If there are specific issues affecting your child's attendance please speak with staff in school to see what support we can provide to stop your child missing out on important opportunities for learning.

Next half term we will be holding a Golden Week for attendance between Monday 18th and Friday 22nd March when the aim will be for us to achieve whole school attendance of 96%. This will take a big effort from all families but is definitely achievable. We are organising a whole school reward for meeting the target which will be enjoyed by all of our pupils providing we meet the goal. Let's do it!

GWOBR ARAIN CYMRAEG - WELSH SILVER AWARD PROGRESS

Criw Cymraeg have been very busy working alongside staff and pupils in the school this term. Since Christmas, new sashes have been introduced to reward staff and children who have been speaking the Welsh language both inside and outside of the classroom. The sash allows children to go for lunch 10 minutes early, every day for the week, as their reward for 'Seren yr Wythnos'. This term we have also been very focussed on developing the Welsh language outside of the classroom. Criw Cymraeg have set up numerous yard games for children to



play in Welsh on the yard, these games include: 'Pysgod', 'Faint o'r gloch Mr Blaidd' and 'Hop Scotch'. Criw Cymraeg have also developed a fruit menu and taken over the 'tuck shop' on the yard. We run the shop using Welsh to promote the Welsh language – no Welsh, no fruit!

Next term, our focus turns to setting up reading sessions with our younger children. Criw Cymraeg will regularly visit Foundation Phase classes and read Welsh stories to them. Also, we hope to turn our attention to teaming up with the Digital Leaders and holding an assembly to share how to use the Welsh apps and websites such as 'Campau Cosmig'. Look out for a year group open session which will also help you - the parents/carers - on how to use these apps at home.
