OPERATION ENCOMPASS



The school is taking part in a project run jointly between schools and Gwent Police.

Operation Encompass is the reporting to schools, prior to 9.00 am on the next school day, when a child or young person has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident. Operation Encompass will

ensure that a member of the school staff, known as a Key Adult, will use the information that has been shared, in confidence, in order to support any children who have been involved in, or exposed to, a domestic abuse incident.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.

PHONES

Just a reminder that pupils should not bring phones to school. There is no need for pupils to have phones during the school day or before school starts in the morning. AMBULANCE STATION

I need to bring to your attention a serious safety concern notified to us by the staff of Pontypool Ambulance Station.

At the end of each school day, parents park their vehicles in the shared car park at the rear of the Ambulance Station and make their way to the school to collect children. On return to the car park, parents and children are cutting through the top car park of the station. As you can appreciate, this is a high traffic area and can be quite hazardous due to large vehicles manoeuvring within the car park as well as emergency vehicles exiting the garages quickly due to the nature of the ambulance service role. A near miss incident has been recently reported by a staff member who was reversing a vehicle when a parent and several children walked through the car park causing the driver to abandon the manoeuvre until they had safely passed through. Staff who park their cars at the top car park and have also reported damage to vehicles from children and parents that squeeze past. This damage is mainly scratching to bodywork from the school bags and buggies pushed by parents between the closely parked cars.

In the interest of safety and to avoid further incidents, please can all parents who park in the shared car park at the rear of the ambulance station walk to and from the school using the pavements outside the station boundary and not crossing the station forecourt.
