FOREST SCHOOL

We have been running Forest School sessions throughout this term as usual. These sessions are very popular with pupils and provide a regular opportunity for them to develop their learning and use their skills in a practical outdoor setting.

This year we are creating an additional Forest School area on the playing field and taking older year groups for half-day sessions to Tranch Woods, to extend their experience as we introduce our new 'Wild Passport'.

While we have a stock of protective wet weather clothing and footwear in school, we now need additional time when rotating this. We are increasing the quantity of protective clothing and wellies available but also ask for your support in doing the following:

COASTAL SCHOOL

ILLNESS / CORONAVIRUS SYMPTOMS

We are at a time of the year when various bugs are in circulation. As we have advised before, if your child has a slight cold and is well enough to be in school then they should attend. However, if your child or anyone else in your household, has symptoms that could indicate that they have coronavirus they will need to be tested. Your entire household will need to self-isolate at least until the test result is received.

The symptoms that mean a test is needed are:

- a high temperature this means that you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough it may be worse than normal)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've notice you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If your child, or someone they live with is being tested then they and everyone they live with should stay at home. This includes any siblings.

As usual, we request that all parents/carers contact school on the first day of absence if your child is unwell. If your child, or a family member, is being tested please tell us this at the same time.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES should a child who has symptoms, or lives with someone who has symptoms, attend school.
