

# WORLD BOOK DAY (WBD) / READING SESSIONS FOR PARENTS/CARERS

Next week we will be running a series of activities in school and through home learning to celebrate World Book Day (WBD) and to promote reading for pleasure. While the official WBD took place yesterday, we have moved events to next week so that we could focus on our Eisteddfod at the very beginning of

March and still celebrate World Book Day close to the 'actual' date. Activities linked to WBD will be shared with key stage 2 pupils via Seesaw and in a celebration assembly at the end of the week.

As teachers and parents we share a commitment to the importance of developing every child's reading skills. No other aspect of each child's development has such singular value for all other areas of learning. This year we have invested additional time and money in extra resources to help support pupils' reading. In particular two linked online platforms, Accelerated Reader and MyON, are now being used to provide increased opportunity for pupils to enjoy a wide range of reading material that engages their interest and is

well matched to their reading ability. Both Accelerated Reader and MyON can be accessed in school and at home. In order to share information about how these platforms work and how they can help support pupil's interest in reading we are holding online information sessions for parents/carers of children in Years 3, 4 and 5 next week. All the sessions start at 1.30 and will last for about half an hour. Sessions can be joined through your child's MS Teams space. We look forward to seeing you there.

### **RETURN OF KEY STAGE 2 PUPILS**
