ACCESS THROUGH ST ALBAN'S CHURCH GROUNDS

As you may be aware, some time ago Father Hayman very kindly offered to permit families walking to and from school to access the church grounds from the steps on George Street through to Conway Road to avoid the difficult corner junction. This pedestrian route means passing directly in from of Father Hayman's home and through his parking area.

I was upset and disappointed this week to hear from Father Hayman that some individuals (adults and children) have been using this route without the respect for his property or privacy that should be expected. Worse still, on one occasion when he spoke with people walking through his property to request that children using scooters be properly supervised, he received an unwelcome and offensive response.

I do not know if the individuals concerned are families of George Street, though I hope not. In any event, I would like to advise all families that there is **no right of way through the church grounds.** This access has been allowed by Father Hayman on the basis that users treat his property with consideration and courtesy. Could anyone using this route please make sure that children are properly supervised when doing so and that the area is respected as it should be. Thank you.
